





#### **Fusarium Fungal Disease on Greens at Little Hay**

The issues we are experiencing on the greens at the moment was down to an aggressive fungal attack we experienced in January 2017. This resulted in the infected areas of grass being killed off.

We are currently not experiencing any fungal activity. The greens were given 3 applications of fungicide between January and April. Once the disease has taken hold the damage cannot be reversed.

For the greens to start any recovery we need the ground temperatures to be constantly above 10 degrees. Once this happens the greens will start to recover very quickly.

I can assure you we are doing all we can at this time. The greens have been fertilised twice and top dressed. The irrigation system is also working daily. The grass species in the greens is predominantly annual meadow grass. This grass species is the most susceptible to this disease. The other grass in the greens is bent grass, this is more resistant to the fungal disease.

We will be starting a five year programme of over seeding all of the greens starting in September 2017. The seed we will be using will be 100% bent grass at a cost of £15,000. This grass will be a lot more resistant to any future fungal attacks.

September is the best time for over seeding as the ground temperatures are still warm and there is also less chance of heavy rain that could result in the seed being washed away. We will also be using a new generation of turf fungicides starting in Autumn 2017. Thank you for your continued support at this time.

The Modern History of Berkhamsted Golf Club Through the eyes of Gaius Potton


